SIIM Awards Dinner Planned

Recent Federation Ballot Results

At our November meeting members discussed and voted on several Federation Laws & Resolutions amendments that had been proposed by the SIA Board of Directors and approved at the SIA convention in Vancouver last July. Our club spent some time discussing three of the nine proposals. The increase in Federation dues, which we voted against because of the step-up schedule for the increase, passed with 589 clubs voting for and 219 clubs voting against. The Cost of Living adjustment, to be initiated by the SIA Board, passed with 561 votes for and 247 votes against. The proposal to change the selection of SIA Fundraising Council members from election to appointment passed with 750 for and 55 against. All of the proposals on the ballot were passed. Interestingly, Federation had 1,311 clubs in good standing and eligible to vote and, of those, 1,280 clubs voted.

Virginia Wagner Award Update

Chairs Careth Flash and Mary Shelby report that we have submitted five eligible applications to our judges for evaluation. The judges have been asked to reply by February 14. Our winning applicant must be submitted to District Director Bev Bahr by February 19 for district 2 judging.
